# Pike Place Market Master Artisan and Community Service Award

In March, PDA staff and Daystall community presented senior craftsperson Chuck Pefley an award for his nearly two decades of volunteer service on the Daystall Screening Committee, as well as his long tenure as a respected master craftsperson. The "Pike Place Market Master Artisan and Community Service Award" was crafted by a trio of Daystall artisans, including woodworker Kris Sacksteder, glassblower Gina Karaba, and Charles Saul, who wired the trophy light effect and laser-etched the face plate. As a longtime senior member of the Daystall Screening Committee, Chuck Pefley served as a steward of the standards for handmade craft and was involved in bringing in well over half of the current 230 craftspeople. Chuck, who recently retired after nearly 40 years of selling his work in the Market, is widely appreciated for his exceptionally crafted flameworked glass, his good-natured humor and his generous support and mentoring of younger, newer craftspeople.

#### Bonus Card to Fresh Bucks

On May 31, the Highstall Dollars and Bonus Card programs wrap up for the season and SNAP/EBT Fresh Bucks matching begins. New this year, Fresh Bucks matching is unlimited and can be used for dried, frozen and canned fruits, veggies, mushrooms or herbs in addition to fresh produce and veggie starts.

EBT cards can be swiped in The Market Commons, Monday-Friday, 9 a.m. - 4 p.m. to receive Fresh Bucks. These can be used at Pike Market farmer tents, Growing Washington highstall and the four off-site Pike Place Farmers Market locations at City Hall, First Hill, South Lake Union and The Regrade, where shoppers can receive Fresh Bucks.
