To all restaurant tenants, remind your employees that Pike Place Market cannot recycle any ceramics like plates, bowls and cups. Broken or chipped glassware cannot be recycled either. These items must go in the garbage.

Opening on the Pike Place Market Historical Commission

There is currently a vacancy for a Market Merchant (business owners, craft and produce merchants) on the Pike Place Market Historical Commission. The Historical Commission reviews and approves all use and design changes within the Market historic district. The Commission includes two Market merchants, one Market property owner, one at-large member, two Market residents, two architects and two members from the Friends of the Market and Allied Arts of Seattle organizations. Members serve a three-year term with a minimum time commitment of five hours a month. The Mayor of Seattle appoints all members, subject to City Council confirmation.

Commission meetings are held on the second and fourth Wednesdays of each month at 4:30 p.m. Members of the Commission serve because they are deeply committed to preserving the architectural, cultural, economic and historical value of Pike Place Market. Members are volunteers and do not receive financial compensation.
